WELCOME BACK DAY & FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL: Students and families, please plan to attend Welcome Back Day on August 30th, between 12:00 and 5:00 PM. CURRENT STUDENT ONLINE REGISTRATION: Please login to your Family Access and complete the Online Registration for each child that currently attends the School District of Altoona. The program allows you to verify and update your contact information, emergency contacts and health information. We ask that you leave the medical information BLANK if it does not apply. Please do not put N/A or none. You will complete ONE Food Service Application per family. If you have more than one child, please check the box stating you do not want to complete another application.



Child Development Day

The School District of Altoona has discussed best practices regarding Child Find activities. Upon receiving guidance from the U.S. Office of Special Education Programs and the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, we have decided to refine our process to align with a "comprehensive child find system."

Comprehensive child find systems are ongoing efforts to support families in the understanding and awareness of developmental needs, from birth to 21 years of age, therefore, recognizing children with disabilities. For children ages 3 and up, until they enter kindergarten, we will send the Ages and Stages Questionnaire form home for families to complete relative to their day-to-day observations of their child. Once complete, please mail the form back to Altoona Elementary School (157 Bartlett Ave., Altoona, WI 54720) or drop it off in the office for Alex Franseen, Early Childhood Teacher. Once received, the school district will do the following:



- Score the assessment
- Summarize and provide an explanation of the results
- Provide resources to support the continued development of your child

Why Attendance Matters

Why is attendance important?

Regular attendance in school is very important to a child's learning. When a child is absent more than other children in kindergarten, their achievement in reading, math and general knowledge is lower in 1st grade. Regardless of other challenges a child faces, absences from school negatively impact achievement. The same trends are seen in other grade levels. The more school a child misses, the more difficult it is for that child to stay on pace with their peers in learning.

The practice of good attendance not only helps your child learn and grow academically, but it also sets good habits for attendance in post-secondary classes and future jobs and careers. Ensuring that your child is attending school sets him or her up for success in the present as well as the future.

What does good attendance look like?

Good attendance means missing less than 10% of school days. Sometimes absences are necessary, such as when a child is ill, however, both excused and unexcused absences equally affect a child's success in school. In Altoona, we have 172.5 days of school each year. This means missing less than 17.25 days of school per year, or less than 2 days per month. For middle school and high school students, it is also important to consider class period attendance to ensure your child isn't missing the same class multiple times for illness, orthodontist or doctor appointments, etc.

Where can I find support for my child's attendance?

We realize that every family faces challenges: illness, transportation, child care, or scheduling demands. Please contact your child's teacher, counselor, or principal if your family needs help dealing with these challenges to your child's good school attendance. We will do our best to help your family ensure that your child's school attendance stays on track.

The Annual Meeting for the School District of Altoona will be held September 25th at 6:30 pm in the Pedersen Commons. The meeting will include an annual report on the state of the District and a review of the draft 2023-2024 budget.

At the Annual Meeting, residents of the School District of Altoona will have the opportunity to participate in a hearing on the draft budget for 2023-2024. The budget will be presented by fund and will include for discussion any additional proposed debt service payments. Residents of the District will vote on the tax levy at the conclusion of the Budget Hearing.

Anyone who meets the below criteria is eligible to vote at the meeting:

- Is at least 18 years of age
- Is a resident of the School District of Altoona for a minimum of 28 consecutive days preceding the meeting
- · Is not a convicted felon

A Message from Student Transit:

Student Transit would like to welcome you and your child to the 2023-2024 school year! We look forward to serving the families of the School District of Altoona each year. We understand the excitement and apprehension the very first day of school brings to students and families. It is our goal to make this day, as well as every day, a safe and pleasant experience.

Our staff is available each day, so please do not hesitate to contact us with any questions or concerns. Know that any issues that come up should also be mentioned to your driver, as they are the first contact. During the school year, our staff is available to answer your questions from 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM and 8:00 AM - 4:00 PM during the summer months (715-839-5116).

To ensure your child has a safe, efficient and enjoyable ride to and from school each day, please take the time to read over the following information.

- + Communicate to Student Transit any health issues, such as peanut or bee allergy, that would be important for us to know, or if your child is Special Needs. Direct communication with our office staff and your student's driver ensures your child will receive the support necessary for a positive school bus experience.
- + Go over the bus expectations and discuss riding safely. Your efforts will help us reinforce good bus rider behavior.
- + Write your child's name, address and phone number inside of their backpack and jacket.
- + Please have your child ride the bus the first few days of school if they will normally ride each day. This will help us get to know your student, establish the routine of the route, and help your child become more comfortable riding the bus each day.
- + Please be patient if your child's bus is running a few minutes late the first few days of school. We want to give our newest riders the time to say goodbye if needed.
- + For those with a Kindergarten student, please remind them to sit at the front. This helps our driver get to know and to help remind them when we reach their stop.
- + If you wish to allow your child to ride home with a friend, please call or send a written request with your child. This must be signed by the school office. Without written permission your child will not be allowed to be dropped anywhere except their designated stop.
- + Most locations will be at corners. Unless your child is the only one at a pick up location, there's no need to call us if they won't be riding. To help keep the bus on schedule, please be sure that students are at the bus stop a few minutes prior to pick up.
- + It is important to let us know of any changes in pick up or drop off locations.
