



#### Learning Together: Professional Development

The School District of Altoona staff engage in learning throughout the year to best support students and each other. Staff learned from experts in areas such as professional learning communities, using student data for educational decision-making, and implementing strategies to address students' diverse needs. The process of learning remains ongoing, not just for students, but also for the dedicated staff members of the School District of Altoona!

# Elementary Math Learning: How Did that Happen?

In Fall 2022, Altoona Elementary School embarked on an exciting math journey by introducing a new resource called Bridges. The impact was remarkable, with both students and staff witnessing significant improvements in math skills right from the start—a cause for celebration! The teaching approach involves revisiting key concepts multiple times through spirals and integrating hands-on learning activities to keep students engaged. Through this method, students are equipped with various problem-solving strategies, ensuring that everyone can excel at a high level.



## Celebrating Literacy with Ginormous Pumpkins

In late September, the School District of Altoona joined forces with the City of Altoona to take part in the Ginormous Pumpkin Event at River Prairie. Ahead of the event, 2nd-grade students from Altoona Elementary had the chance to explore the colossal pumpkins up close. This engaging activity aligned with themes in both Science and Reading.

During the event, Altoona Elementary set up a booth to promote literacy activities with a Fall BINGO game. Despite the rain, the day brimmed with enjoyable activities and stood as a delightful celebration of community!

#### Chippewa Valley Technical College Simulation Camp

In collaboration with CVTC and the School District of Altoona, 9th and 10th grade students embarked on a four-day exploration of diverse healthcare domains, including Medical Laboratory Technician, Medical Assistant, Nursing, Respiratory Therapy, and Radiography. This experience emphasized the significance of collaboration among healthcare professionals, illustrating how various healthcare sectors unite to deliver optimal patient care. Students had the opportunity to participate in hands-on activities such as conducting assessments, drawing blood, and simulating the placement of a breathing tube on a mannequin patient. Additionally, they successfully earned their CPR certification.

# Empowering Minds: The Evolution of our Computer Science Course

At our school, students from grades 1 through 12 receive their own Chromebooks, which they start using for homework from grade 6 onwards. Even our youngest learners in kindergarten are introduced to technology through regular classes where they learn essential skills such as logging in, typing, and using educational software programs. Importantly, we emphasize internet safety and responsibility at age-appropriate levels. Here at Altoona Elementary School, we believe in starting early to equip our students with vital digital literacy skills, ensuring they are prepared for the challenges of tomorrow!

#### Empowering Students: The Courage Retreat Experience

After a COVID-induced hiatus, the Courage Retreat made a triumphant return in Spring 2023! This retreat is a vital component of the Social/Emotional Curriculum for Altoona Middle School. The 7th-grade students visited UW-Eau Claire, while the 8th-grade students engaged in activities at Valley Sports Academy, who generously provided their facility for our use. Alongside the middle schoolers, 25 high school mentors added to the excitement and enthusiasm by leading various small group activities. Facilitated by Youth Frontiers, an organization based in Minneapolis, the Courage Retreat aimed to achieve the following key learning objectives:

- 1. Identify personal fears and understand that everyone has them.
- 2. Commit to acting with courage to make school a better place.
- 3. Deepen relationships with classmates to break down social barriers.

#### Supporting Emotional Regulation Through Mindfulness

One of the district's annual goals centers on enhancing students' emotional regulation, a crucial factor in their academic achievements. Proficiency in this skill is evident through the capacity to manage and respond suitably to various experiences or emotions. To promote positive coping mechanisms, several staff members have integrated mindfulness activities into their lessons. Here are some examples of the strategies they are implementing:

- Take a calming tool from the tool box. Use it and put it back.

- Take deep breaths (e.g. box breathing)
- Take a short walk with teacher permission
- Talk with a trusted adult about the situation
- Verbally advocate for academic needs during class




#### Meet Our New Food Service Director


#### Financial Trends
