4K registration opens February 7th!

Our Altoona School District 4K Program is located at our Early Education Center, 754 Bartlett Avenue, Altoona. Our 4 year old Kindergarten program has a play-based focus, while preparing your child for Kindergarten and beyond. Our curriculum provides school readiness skills, social emotional development, enriched academics, and school expectations. We strive to maintain small class sizes and focus on the individual needs of our students. We are the only 4K program connected with our school district, we work closely with the Elementary staff to make this a seamless transition to Kindergarten, and our program is provided at no cost.

4K is a half day program (morning and afternoon options) that runs four days a week. Children who are four years old by September 1, 2022 are eligible. 4K

Fundamentals with Fundations

Do you remember watching Sesame Street as a youngster and Grover would start at the left of the screen with a 'c'? He would then run to the right of the screen to get the -at. He would slide the 'c' and -at together and voila! He made the word cat! It was magic!

Learning to read involves many different skills and practices but this year, AES K-2 students are learning about these fundamentals with Fundations. Fundations focuses on phonological and phonemic awareness, the building blocks of spoken and written language. Using a multi-sensory approach, students are "tapping it out," "marking" glued sounds, and even "scooping" sentences. Students are also learning spelling patterns and how to form letters each day. We are having so much FUN learning to read with FUNdations!





High Performance of 4K Attendees

Since moving to our Altoona Early Education Center, our students have shown amazing growth during their 4K school year and are entering Kindergarten with a huge advantage in their development. For those students who attended our 4K program, 94% went into Kindergarten meeting the expectation for knowing their letter sounds. For those who attended elsewhere, 66% went into Kindergarten meeting the expectation for knowing their letter sounds. This is very exciting data to share with our community!



Future-Ready OUTCOMES

Integrating Media/Technology in AMS

In 7th and 8th grade Fabulous FabLab class, we are using various machines, processes, and technologies to create our custom made LED light box. The students design their light box which is then laser engraved and cut out by a laser engraver, then they assemble and glue it together. Once dry, the students practice their electrical knowledge of the flow of electricity and solder together the LED light, battery snap, and on/off switch. Once assembled completely, they can insert their custom designed acrylic sign on the top.


School-Based Mental Health Scholarship Fund

Media Productions Project Using Grant Dollars

This past fall, the School District was awarded a \$4,200 School and Student Support grant by the Mayo Health System. Part of this grant money is currently being used and will continue to be used to create content to aid Altoona School District students in making safe and healthy choices. This content is being created by Altoona High School's Media Production class. Students use many platforms to create content to help encourage healthy decisions. Some examples of projects in the works are: using Pixton and Stop Motion Studio to create PSA cartoons and videos about a topic that students feel need to be addressed, creating videos about the dangers and consequences of vaping and designing social media posts and posters on Canva to help make students aware of healthy ways to deal with stress. Students really enjoy creating content with a purpose; one student commented, "I loved the creative freedom I get each project and the fact that my projects are actually being used for a purpose in the school and community." Some of these projects are shared with specific audiences, and some are shared on our Facebook and Instagram pages. 




