WELCOME BACK DAY: Students and families, please plan to attend Welcome Back Day on August 30th, between 12:00 and 5:00 PM. Please watch for an email from your child's school with additional details and instructions.

CURRENT STUDENT ONLINE REGISTRATION: Please login to your Family Access and complete the Online Registration for each child that currently attends the School District of Altoona. The program allows you to verify and update your contact information, emergency contacts and health information. We ask that you leave the medical information BLANK if it does not apply. Please do not put N/A or none. You will complete ONE Food Service Application per family. If you have more than one child, please check the box stating you do not want to complete another application.

NEW TO THE DISTRICT? (ALL GRADES) If you or someone you know has not yet enrolled their child for the 2022 – 2023 school year, please visit our district website to complete the online enrollment application at https://skyward.iscorp.com/scripts/wsisa.dll/WService=wsedualtoonawi/skyenroll.w

Railway Mentoring Program Frequently Asked Questions:

HOW ARE BIGS SELECTED? Bigs are recruited from a number of sources. Big Brothers Big Sisters works with local businesses, service groups, colleges, or the general public at events to identify a diverse group of volunteers. We want to make a match that is based on mutual interests or complementary traits in order to create the strongest bond possible.

HOW ARE BIGS AND LITTLES MATCHED? Bigs and Littles are matched based on complementary attitudes and similar interests. Our process starts with an application to gather preliminary information and then an interview to help us assess all parties' hopes for the program. We find that the more our Bigs and Littles have in common from the get-go the better their match will go. We'll explain why we've selected your match prior to meeting so you'll have a chance to decide if it feels like a good fit to you.

HOW LONG WILL MY CHILD BE MATCHED WITH A BIG? We ask for a commitment of at least one year but matches can participate in the Big Brothers Big Sisters programs until the Little has graduated from High School.

WHAT TYPES OF ACTIVITIES WILL THE BIG DO WITH MY CHILD? Our team stresses mutually agreed-upon decision-making when it comes to match activities. That may be a game or a walk or simply talking. Think of things you'd expect friends to do and that's what we expect from our matches.

IS THERE ANY COST TO PARTICIPATING? There is no cost to participate in our programs.

WHAT HAPPENS IN THE SUMMER? Our school-based programs only meet during times that school is in session. When it comes to the Summer, your match will not meet - though we encourage matches to find an alternate way of communicating during break time. Maybe a postcard or a text message or just a short note to tell each other what's happening.

WHAT DO YOU DO WITH THE INFORMATION ON THE APPLICATION? The information provided on our application is used to make safe matches, assess community needs, and determine match compatibility. No private information is ever shared, however, some demographic information is occasionally anonymized to allow our organization to assess and share demographic trends.

WHO CAN I CONTACT IF I HAVE ANY QUESTIONS ABOUT THE PROGRAM? We have a great team of professionals that you'll work with. Initially, our CR team will guide you through the process and work with you. When you call 715-835-0161 you'll likely get our office manager, Cherity Germain. But once you're matched we assign a dedicated Match Support Specialist to work with your match and ensure it progresses in a positive way.

HOW LONG WILL IT TAKE FOR MY CHILD TO BE MATCHED WITH THEIR BIG? Great question! Because of the personalized nature of our process, it can vary. We endeavor to match children as quickly as possible but factors such as volunteer compatibility or availability can cause delays.

Child Development Day

Recently, the School District of Altoona has discussed best practices when it comes to Child Find activities. Upon receiving guidance from the U.S. Office of Special Education Programs and the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, we have decided to refine our process to be more in line with a "comprehensive child find system." Comprehensive child find systems are ongoing efforts to support families in the understanding and awareness of developmental needs, from birth to 21 years of age, therefore, recognizing children with disabilities.

As a result of this shift, for children ages 3 and up, until they enter kindergarten, we will no longer be holding a Child Development Day, as we have done in the past. Rather, we will be sending the Ages and Stages Questionnaires, Third Edition (ASQ-3) form home for families to complete, relative to their day to day observations of their child. If you have a child in this range, please look for this questionnaire to be delivered by US Mail to your mailbox by the end of September. Once complete, please mail the form back to Altoona Elementary School or drop off in the office for Kathy Roen, Early Childhood Teacher. Once received, the school district will 1] Score the assessment, 2] Summarize and provide explanation of results and 3] Provide resources to support the continued development of your child.

Direct communication with our ofPce staff and your student's driver ensures your child will receive the support necessary for a positive school bus experience.
- + Go over the bus expectations and discuss riding safely. Your efforts will help us reinforce good bus rider behavior.
- + Write your child's name, address and phone number inside of their backpack and jacket.
- + Please have your child ride the bus the Prst few days of school if they will normally ride each day. This will help us get to know your student, establish the routine of the route, and help your child become more comfortable riding the bus each day.
- + Please be patient if your child's bus is running a few minutes late the Prst few days of school. We want to give our newest riders the time to say goodbye if needed.
- + For those with a Kindergarten student, please remind them to sit at the front. This helps our driver get to know and to help remind them when we reach their stop.
- + If you wish to allow your child to ride home with a friend, please call or send a written request with your child. This must be signed by the school ofPce. Without written permission your child will not be allowed to be dropped anywhere except their designated stop.
- + Most locations will be at corners. Unless your child is the only one at a pick up location, there's no need to call us if they won't be riding. To help keep the bus on schedule, please be sure that students are at the bus stop a few minutes prior to pick up.
- + It is important to let us know of any changes in pick up or drop off locations.
