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Dear Parents and Guardians,

Today the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) released the School Report Cards for 2015/16. The DPI creates a School Report Card and District Report Card for every publicly funded school and district in the state. The Report Cards are intended to help all schools and districts utilize data on specific measures to target improvement efforts to ensure students are ready for the next educational step – including the next grade level, graduation, college, and careers.

The current **School Report Card, based on the 2015/16 school year**, looks a bit different than in the past due to changes required by the legislature. However, the overall idea for how the report cards work is the same. At the foundation of the report cards are four priority areas. Schools and districts receive a score for each priority area:

- **Student Achievement** proficiency in English Language Arts (ELA) and mathematics on state assessments
- **Student Growth** measured by year-to-year improvements in achievement
- **Closing Gaps** in performance between specific student groups (comparing English language learners, low-income students, students with disabilities, and members of a racial or an ethnic group with their peers)
- **On-Track and Postsecondary Readiness** is a measurement using reliable predictors of high school graduation and potential post high school success

Schools and districts are also evaluated on their level of student engagement – test participation rates, chronic absenteeism rates, and dropout rates when applicable. Based on its score, a school or district receives one of five rating categories, from *Fails to Meet Expectations* to *Significantly Exceeds Expectations*, as well as one to five stars.

The report cards are just one source of information about schools and districts, and do not take into account the talent of students in areas like music, art, languages, athletics, technology and the most important aspects of how students work together and help and support one another in our hectic world. I am happy to share with you that our district received four out of five stars which put us in the “Exceeds Expectations” category! We are all so very proud of the work we do here every day and so proud of the students, staff and positive reputation our district shares with our community.
