Building Projects Update

Construction season is underway and Market and Johnson is making progress on our current projects, which include renovations to the high school and construction of our new elementary school just two miles east of our current campus at 157 Bartlett Avenue.

Students, staff and community members are eagerly watching the progress and looking forward to the new educational and recreational opportunities that will be a reality! We thank our Altoona community for making "On Track for the Future" possible with the passing of our recent referendum.

Altoona Elementary School

The official groundbreaking ceremony was held at the new elementary school site on June 2. To get the project off to a great start, four elementary students were selected to be a part of the "shovels on the ground" ceremony! The students were accompanied by their teachers, school officials, city officials, and special guests.

Back at Pedersen Elementary and throughout the district and community, students, staff and community members watched and celebrated the historic event by live-stream. On June 16, with permit in hand, the site clearing process began and crews have continued to clear and grade the land to prepare for the foundation. Altoona High School Project

The remodeling at the high school is in full-speed-ahead mode with a completion date set for the first week in August. The entrance to the high school is receiving a security upgrade including new doors and safety glass to create a safe vestibule entrance. The office area is being re-configured to allow for more efficient use of space and functionality to include a new conference room.

The biggest change is the removal of the lockers which have been relocated throughout the high school in various hallways. The new big open space will be a usable area for students, parents and community members. There will be tables and a variety of chairs for flexible seating and grouping of students and guests for small and large group learning or viewing of athletic events and concerts on the new big screen TV!

Along with a fresh coat of paint and an expanded concession stand we hope this space will provide many opportunities for our students, staff and community members to meet and learn and grow together!

Roof repair and replacement will be done in conjunction with the onsite building projects in the summer of 2016.

Looking Ahead: Altoona Intermediate and Middle School Project

Planning has begun for the remodeling of the intermediate and middle schools in the summer of 2016. The present intermediate school hallway and front of the middle school will be removed. This is the oldest part of the complex and is quickly deteriorating making attempts at repair and restoration too costly to be a fiscally sound alternative. Removing this section of the building will allow for off-street bus and parent drop-offs and pick-ups along with much needed parking. This will also allow for a small addition that will contain a new, secure vestibule entrance to the building along with new school and district offices. The majority of the work on the middle school will involve the redesigning of the HVAC systems, asbestos removal, new roofs for the middle and high school, new flooring in the middle school and some reconfiguring of spaces with fresh paint and general repairs. There is a lot of work to be accomplished over next summer so careful planning and scheduling will need to be in place.

Due to this work our school calendar for the upcoming 2015/16 school year has been modified, through receipt of a waiver from the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI). Our school year will begin on August 19 and end on May 25, 2016 to make the most of the construction season in summer 2016.

General aid for schools

The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction has released the following estimates for 2015-16 general school aid:

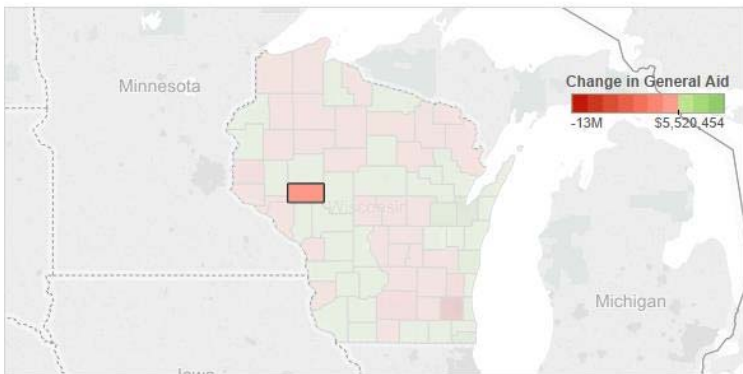
The Department of Public Instruction (DPI) released state aid estimates for 2015/16 general school aid on July 1.

Required by law to give districts estimates of their state aids, the DPI based their figures on K-12 funding proposals making their way through Joint Finance and awaiting approval from the legislature and the Governor. "Aid estimates have been made in prior years when the state budget wasn't finalized by June 30. But budget proposals that would take public school funding to boost private school vouchers and charter schools adds more uncertainty to how the final figures will come out in three months. There's really no way to project that right now," said John Johnson, DPI communications director.

Even with the uncertainty of how the final figures will come out, we are pleased that the projections for the Altoona school district show an increase of \$14,300. While we were hoping to regain some of the aid that was lost in 2014/15, staying level under this projection is encouraging as we work toward finalizing our budget.

As can be seen in the graphic to the left, ours is the only Eau Claire County school district projected to receive an increase in general aid.

All told, Eau Claire County school districts are projected to lose a total of more than \$600,000 in 2015/16.
