

Online Enrollment Begins January 1st, 2019

Dear Parents:

You are invited to participate in *the Altoona School District 4K Program*, our collaborative, community-based four year old kindergarten program, for the 2019-2020 school year. *Altoona 4K* is an enriched, play-based program designed to prepare your child for their educational career. We provide an enriched curriculum that provides school readiness skills and school expectations. We know that our children learn best through play and provide age appropriate activities in cognitive and pre-math skills, social-emotional, adaptive, literacy and language, and motor development. Our 4K program is a half day program (morning and afternoon options) that runs Monday-Thursday. It's a program designed for all children who live in the Altoona School District and who will be four years old by September 1, 2019. Four year old children who have been accepted for open enrollment will also be eligible to participate. The Altoona School District 4K program is provided at no cost. Transportation options are available.

The 2019-2020 *Altoona 4K* program is offered at four community sites:

Little Star Daycare, 2245 Hayden Avenue Western Dairyland Head Start/Altoona Early Education Center, 1314 North Hillcrest Parkway St. Mary's Elementary School, 1828 Lynn Avenue The Little School House of Altoona, 2328 North Hillcrest Parkway Little Minds Matter, 3085 Meadowlark Lane

4K Enrollment is completed online. Please visit our website at www.altoona.k12.wi.us to complete the necessary paperwork. If you do not have access to a computer, we will have some available at the elementary school.

In addition to enrolling online, we require the following forms:

- Original Birth Certificate (we verify the information and return it to you)
- Proof of Residency (mortgage documents or utility bill with your name and address on it)
- Immunization form (only required if your child received their vaccinations from a different state)
- Other important documents if applicable (IEP, court documentation, etc.)

<u>Please bring the above listed forms to the Altoona Elementary School Office, located at 157 Bartlett Avenue, between the hours of 7:30 A.M. and 4:00 P.M., before Friday, May 31, to complete the enrollment process.</u>

Brief Descriptions of the Altoona (4K) 4 Year Old Kindergarten Sites

All Sites:

- employ WI Department of Public Instruction licensed teachers
- utilize the same curricula: The Creative Curriculum for Preschool, a widely used, research-based curriculum which includes all developmental areas, Conscious Discipline and Second Step, curriculums which teach social-emotional, friendship and problem-solving skills, and Handwriting without Tears to help support fine motor development.
- monitor children's progress with the Teaching Strategies GOLD assessment
- screen children's literacy skills with PALS (Phonological Awareness Literacy Screening)-PreK
- communicate with parents via newsletters, notes, and two parent-teacher conferences/year

Little Star Daycare

Little Star is located in Bethlehem Lutheran Church. Our curriculum follows the Wisconsin Model Early Learning Standards, and provides hands-on activities in language arts, math, science, and social studies. We encourage children's individual curiosity and positive social-emotional development in all aspects of our program. Little Star is a licensed child care facility, and child care is available both before and after the 4K program.

The Little School House of Altoona



If my child attends 4K at a faith-based site, will they receive faith-based instruction?

Faith-based instruction will be provided to children outside of the 4K programming hours at the discretion of the site.

Will my child need a physical before they can start?

Pre-school/4K child care partner sites do require a physical. The immunizations that are required by the State of Wisconsin s252.04 for Pre K (2yrs through 4years) are:

4 DTP/DTaP/DT, 3 Polio, 3 HepB, 1 MMR and 1 Varicella (Chickenpox) if the child has not had the disease.

In addition, it is a good health practice to have an annual dental exam for children.





The 4K program is offered at various pre-school/childcare partner sites in Altoona. 4K is a community partnership committed to supporting and nurturing the social and educational growth and development of Altoona children and their families by providing quality learning experiences.

4K Programming

The School District of Altoona's 4K curriculum is based on the Wisconsin Model Early Learning Standards. Altoona uses the "Creative Curriculum" as a guide to foster growth in health and physical development, social and emotional development, language and communication, cognitive and general knowledge, and self help skills.

Children learn through:

- * Dramatic play
- * Block play
- * Art and sensory experiences
- * Literature
- * Discovery
- * Music and movement





Frequently Asked Questions:

What are the requirements for children who wish to enroll in 4K?

Children must be 4 years old on or before September 1 of the enrollment year. He or she must reside in the School District of Altoona boundaries or have applied and been accepted for Open Enrollment.

The 4K program is intended for children turning 4 years of age from September 1 through the previous September 2. Families requesting to delay 5K entrance and enroll their 5K eligible child in 4K should contact the Altoona Elementary building principal at 715-839-6050 before April 30th of the school year prior to enrollment.

Is the 4K programming the same at all sites?

A DPI certified early childhood educator teaches each of the 4K classes and depending on numbers of children enrolled, each classroom may have a paraprofessional to assist the teacher and children. Each site utilizes the same curriculum.

What are the 4K class teacher/student ratios?

The teacher/student ratio in all 4K classes is 1:10 unless an exception is made by the School District Administrative Council.

Where will my child attend 4K?

If a child is currently enrolled in a pre-school/childcare partner site, then the child will have priority to attend 4K at that site. As much as possible, parent site preferences will be honored. After all pre-schools/childcare partner sites are filled the district will add a school-based site only if needed.

Is transportation available for the program?

Yes. A child will be transported directly to and/or from the 4K session in the morning or afternoon. For example, a child can ride the bus directly to the 7:30 am session of 4K. However, if the child attends the childcare setting at 6:30 am and the 4K session starts at 7:30 am, then transportation is the responsibility of the family.

When dropping a child off, the bus driver must see a parent or other responsible adult (this person must be listed on the "persons authorized to receive the child" part of the registration form) before letting the child off the bus. If an authorized person is not present then the child will be brought to Little Star Day Care and parents will be responsible for any childcare services provided.
