SUSPENSION / EXPULSION APPEAL

Suspension Appeal Process

A student or parent may appeal a suspension by providing a written request for a conference with the Superintendent (or administrative designee) within five (5) days of the commencement of the suspension. It will be the responsibility of the student or family to present the information to support why the suspension should be overturned. The Superintendent will meet with the administrator who assigned the suspension after meeting with the parent to ask any follow up questions or seek additional clarification of the incident that resulted in suspension.

The Superintendent (or designee) will consider

- 1) If the suspension was unfair or unjust
- 2) If the suspension was inappropriate given the nature of the offense

The Superintendent will communicate his or her finding in writing within 15 days of the conference. If the Superintendent overturns the suspension, reference to the suspension on the student's record will be expunged.

The student assigned to suspension shall serve the assigned suspension during the period of appeal.

Expulsion Appeal Process

A student (18 years or older) or parent may appeal an expulsion to the Department of Public Instruction. A written letter of appeal may be sent to the Superintendent of Public Instruction. The letter must include the name of the school district, date of the expulsion, and reason for the appeal. The letter should be sent to:
