Mike Markgren, business manager, presented a recommendation to increase the HRA bridge for a one year period (August 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016) from \$1750 to \$2000 for a single health insurance plan and from \$3500 to \$4000 for a family plan. This is an estimated one-time expense of \$70,000 (see 10.k.). Another proposal would allow retirees the option to have the lower of their outgoing rate of insurance or the district base plan, Plan 1/Option 2 deposited into a retirement HRA on their behalf (see 10.1.).

As the legislature prepares to act on the next biennial budget, there are several issues affecting public schools in Wisconsin. As advocates for children and public education in Wisconsin, area superintendents will hold a press conference to discuss several items that will have a profound effect on a school district's ability to meet students' needs in the coming year and in the foreseeable future.

Please join us at 2:00 p.m. on June 25th to learn more. The press conference will be held at the Cooperative Educational Service Agency 10 office at 725 W. Park Avenue in Chippewa Falls. Attached is a list of the most pressing K-12 issues that will be discussed.

As part of our school districts' responsibility to rural Wisconsin communities, it is important for these issues to be brought to your attention. The current state budget and related legislative proposals would have significant and lasting negative implications for the school districts in Wisconsin. Area superintendents believe that sharing this information will raise citizen awareness of the decisions being made about our schools.

The time is now to voice your opinions to legislators. Please be active in advocating for our schools with the legislature and the governor. The future of public schools depends on your involvement.

1. VOUCHERS What do they mean for your community?	Many school districts across the state do not have voucher schools. However, all public school districts across the state will have their <b>state aid reduced</b> in order to allow for voucher expansion for other cities such as Racine, Kenosha and Milwaukee. More schools will be waiting in the wings to access these funds. Millions of dollars are being diverted from funds which <u>should go</u> to local public schools in order to fund private voucher programs <i>not</i> located in our community. These are your public tax dollars being used to pay for a student's private education.	The Legislative Fiscal Bureau has estimated a loss of state aid to public schools amounting to \$600 million to \$800 million in the first ten years of this law. Voucher expansion means less money for all public schools, including public schools in your own community.		
2. VOUCHER IMPACT What is the long-range voucher impact on my district?	Students from public schools could receive vouchers to attend private religious or secular schools. Schools would lose \$7,856 for <u>each</u> high school student from area districts to support private and religious school education - these funds are state tax dollars, collected from you. If private schools around the state are publicly funded as proposed, public schools will struggle to maintain the educational quality that people in your community have worked so hard to build. The law will guarantee funding increases for each voucher student while public school children are receiving no increase in their revenue limit in the next two years. There is also a discrepancy regarding the "dollars following the student." \$7,210 follows an elementary/middle school student to a private school and \$7,856 will follow a high school student to a private school. \$6,635 will follow a PreK-12 student to a public school.	Did you know that in 1990 the Milwaukee voucher program had 300 students, and today it has more than 26,000 full time students? The same exponential growth is possible with increased voucher funding. That means more of your tax funds will go to schools not even in your own community. Examples already exist suggesting inappropriate management of voucher revenue. If allowed to continue under the current system, this problem will also expand as the number of participating private schools increases.

3. SPECIAL EDUCATION VOUCHERS What happens with special education and vouchers? How will this affect me?	The proposed law allows students in special education to use \$12,000 annually in publicly funded vouchers to attend private and parochial schools. In these schools they would not be guaranteed the legal rights and protections afforded to them by federal law, because those schools are not obligated to do so. Specifically, parents of special needs children oppose this legislation because private schools are not required to follow the federal Individuals With Disabilities Education Act. According to a recent article in the Cap Times, parents believe that tax dollars need to stay in public schools to fund the education that they were meant to provide. Not all special education costs are equal. Costs vary dependent on the categorical classification of special needs ranging from a learning disability identified in an IEP to a child with severe cognitive needs. A "one size fits all" dollar amount assumption for special education students is flawed.	Public schools must serve all students. As the legislature allocates money for special education students to attend private/parochial schools, it has decreased funding for public school special education students. This compounds the economic challenges that public schools have faced for more than <u>eight years</u> .

4. PUBLIC SCHOOL FUNDING REDUCTIONS What happens with funding and my taxes? Why the big deal?	Wisconsin is below the national average in per pupil spending in education. The legislature is allocating money to private voucher schools at the expense of maintaining a public system. Remember, <i>as state aid decreases and your local</i> <i>property taxes increase,</i> more and more of the resources in your community will be diverted to other districts under the current proposals. A significant amount of money that is defined as K-12 funding in the state budget is actually money that is used to reduce property taxes and is not new money that allows the district to spend more on educational opportunities for kids. The property tax credit is a disproportionate distribution of public funds used to support education, having a greater impact on property taxes in districts with higher property valuations. In this budget, over \$300 million is defined as funding for K-12 schools, but not one cent of that money can be	Wisconsin's ability to ensure continued economic and job growth depends on a high quality educational system. If this trend continues it will be impossible for Wisconsin public schools to maintain the high quality educational programs that have existed for decades.

5. FUNDING FREEZE How much is needed to keep running schools? What is the problem with the zero base for funding?	The legislature plans to freeze revenues. This means no future cost-of-living increases for the district. Costs for all services from transportation to materials and general services rise annually.	It is imperative to be able to pay for necessary services. In addition, this means no increase in compensation for teachers and other staff. This threatens the district's ability to attract and retain high quality faculty now and into the future. Current funding proposals are at the 2009 level for funding. Operating at 2009 funding levels will force districts to continue to reduce services.	
6. CO-CURRICULAR Should homeschool students be allowed to play sports in public schools?	Public schools provide athletics and other co-curricular activities because of their educational value. School- based athletic programs are not a community or a recreational program designed for the general public. Co-curricular activities provided by schools are an extension of the classroom and of the educational day for students enrolled in the school. The new law would allow home schooled students and virtual school students to participate in any co-curricular or athletic team our district offers. Students from area private schools would also be eligible to participate on their public school teams in certain sports. This raises a multitude of eligibility questions and different eligibility requirements for members of the same team. Students at home or in a virtual setting, cannot be monitored to ensure they are in compliance with district policies and handbook requirements. This is not fair to our students who work to maintain district expectations.	Athletic programs could become like the club programs offered in other countries. These club programs would not be a part of a school program. They would be offered outside of the school setting and would only be available to children that can afford the cost of these club programs and kids with elite talents that are specifically recruited for these club teams. The goal of these programs is winning, not an extension of learning.

7. DILUTE DIPLOMAS What does a high school diploma mean and why are portfolios such a big deal?	The new law would allow "learning portfolios" to replace up to <i>one-half of the credits needed to graduate</i> <i>from high school</i> . Concerns include the likelihood that the rigor needed to earn a high school diploma will be significantly reduced, jeopardizing both in and out-of- state college acceptance. Students work hard to pass rigorous coursework, and then can go to <i>any college</i> . Since some <i>higher</i> <i>education schools do not accept portfolios</i> , our students would be limited in their educational options. <i>Clearly, this is contrary to the professional opinions</i> <i>of educators, parents and even lawmakers who</i> <i>have worked diligently over the past several</i> <i>decades to increase the rigor and relevance of</i> <i>school curriculum.</i>	Most people could assume that any lessening of academic rigor for school-age students will have a growing and significant effect on Wisconsin's children's ability to compete with their peers across the US and the world. Wisconsin's economic position will also be threatened if the quality of its educational system declines.

8. LICENSE TO TEACH Who is teaching and who can teach our children?	The new law eliminates many standards for licensing teachers, with <i>no</i> bachelor's degree needed to teach our students in multiple subject areas. Many schools do NOT intend to hire non-certified teachers or teachers without a college degree, but concerns exist about just who is teaching in Wisconsin. Why have this law, passed at the last minute, at all?	Current licensed and degreed teachers pass rigorous course-work and pass examinations to demonstrate proficiencies in their areas of expertise. This law eliminates that expectation, and potentially allows those without the study of childhood development to teach in schools in Wisconsin. Placing teachers without specific knowledge in areas of child development, social needs, and cultural and racial sensitivity in charge of students will have long-term effects. It is likely that there will be more discipline issues, greater student and parent dissatisfaction, possible lawsuits due to lack of knowledge about sexual harassment, non-discrimination, and civil rights and special education laws. Further, there will be less sensitivity to students with special education needs.

9. TESTING There is so much testing. How will I know my child is attending a quality school district?	Our students have done well on the standardized tests they are given. Yet testing demands take a toll on everyone. Common sense tells us adequate comparison can only be made when students in each district are taking the same standardized tests over a period of time. The standardized state tests that students are required to take will be different for the <i>third consecutive year</i> . Districts will not be required to take the same test; making district-to-district comparisons very difficult. Testing should be used to help students, not evaluate schools. Giving different tests over the years will not show us where a student is having difficulty, what gaps exist in the curriculum, if a student has missed something along the way, or if a teacher is not effective.	There will be less addressing the needs of individual students and more to teaching to the entire class. There will be more emphasis on "the right answer" and less on understanding. Multiple choice, one-word answers, and even 1- 2 sentence answers do not give us an understanding of how the child thinks and what the child knows, only that the child can memorize really well.			
10. CONSTITUTIONAL REQUIREMENTS If the law states the state must fund public schools, why aren't they?	The Wisconsin Constitution requires that public education must exist in Wisconsin. If it must exist, it must be funded to meet the needs of all the children we serve. We need to have lawmakers honor the value of that public education which is available to all for all.	If we do not insist that the Constitution is followed, what basic freedom will be next?
